FROM BUZY TO OLORON-SAINTE-MARIE

The Voie de Piémont continues along the foothills of the Pyrenees, besides the Gave d'Ossau valley which it follows, meets and crosses before reaching Oloron-Sainte-Marie, the site of the junction with the GR® 653 "la voie d'Arles". It is a natural leg that crosses through woods, forests and prairies and runs along the stream. It is punctuated with villages that will charm you thanks to their typical appearance and their historic dimension.


Getting to the departure point:



From Pau, follow signs to Oloron-Sainte-Marie via Gan (N134) and, after passing through "Bel-air" (lovely panorama), turn left toward Buzy via the D34 (23 km). From Oloron-Sainte-Marie, follow signs to Pau (N134) and, in Herrère, turn right onto the D920 until Buzy (14 km). Coaches managed by the Pyrénées-Atlantiques Departmental Council run to Buzy. For your return: Coaches managed by the Departmental Council (Citram) run from Oloron-Sainte-Marie (Oloron-Sainte-Marie – Buzy line). For information, call 05 59 40 36 60 or visit www.transports.cg64.fr. There is also an SNCF station. For information, call 3635.

D (706496 4778396). Take Rue Larribau. Pass by the left of the washhouse and continue straight ahead. Pass by the stream and take a sunken lane across the way. Follow this lane until Buziet. After the washhouse, turn left onto Rue de Mesplé then go left **0h25** until you come to Place Nolivos ① (705120 4778972). Cross the square, pass by the stream and turn right onto Chemin Sus in Castet which you will take straight ahead until Ogeu-les-Bains. At the junction with Rue de Loureau, veer left to reach the picnic area ② (702722 4779855). Exit the picnic area via the southwest (washhouse) and walk up Chemin des Quatre Chênes. At the next junction, continue straight ahead. At the fork (picnic area, barbecue), turn right onto the gravel path and keep going for 2.2 km. At the T junction, fork left until you come to **1h05** the Bordes farm (Rue des Pyrénées plaque) ③ (700604 4780810). Turn left after this farm. At the fork, stay on the same path that runs down to the left. When you exit the wood, cross a first prairie, following the tractor tracks (west southwest). When entering the second prairie, veer left and, after 30 m, at the fork, turn right onto the uphill tractor trail (west southwest). Keep on straight ahead and when you come to the last large isolated oak tree, bear right which will take you to the prairie edge and a yellow-marked PR® trail that you will take to the left **1h50** 4h40 Sainte-Marie cathedral ⑥ (693714 4784410).

(southwest). Cross through a new prairie (west then southwest), enter the wood and continue along the path (south southwest) for 100 meters. At the first junction (elevation 304), veer right (west). The path runs down to Gave d'Ossau then follows it for 2 km, until it reaches a culvert on a tributary of the stream. Immediately after this, bear left onto a small trail in the undergrowth that runs up toward a dirt path. Follow this path to the left (northwest) on the edge of a field. At the far end of this field (the corner closest to the stream), go into the undergrowth on a trail that follows the bank. At the Malet mill (in ruins), veer left until you come to Pont du Diable, which crosses **3h20** the stream ④ (697300 4782330). Cross to the left bank and take a path that ends at the D 338 (2.4 km, junction with the GR® 653) **3h55** ⑤ (695490 4783127). Bear right. At the junction, continue straight ahead on the road that becomes Rue d'Aspe and leads to Place Saint-Pierre. Across the way, take Rue Centulle, which turns left and leads to the Sainte-Croix church. Walk down toward the terraces along the plane trees and take the stairs on your left that run down Rue Labarraque. Take this street on your right until the bridge on the stream, cross it, and across the way, walk back up Rue de Revol, until you reach the Sainte-Marie cathedral **4h40** ⑥ (693714 4784410).

OLORON-SAINTE-MARIE

Geography and history are in the limelight as you discover the development of Oloron-Sainte-Marie. Firstly the geography, with a remarkable location at the confluence of two streams - the Ossau and Aspe streams - which, when they come together, take on the name of Gave d'Oloron, and a

strategic location on a hill 70 m above the confluence, so that crossings to Somport may be monitored.

And history secondly, thanks to which we can discover vestiges dating from the iron age, then traces of the town of Iluro (future Oloron) in administrative

Don't miss:

- **Buziet:** close to the church, memorial paying homage to the Spanish republican guerrillas massacred by the Nazis in 1944.

- **Ogeu-les-Bains:** 17th-century castle, church (door and altarpiece from the 18th century).

- **Oloron-Sainte-Marie:** Sainte-Croix church (sculpted capitals, domes), Sainte-Marie cathedral, UNESCO world heritage site (sculpted portal).




documents from the Late Empire and numerous vestiges from the Roman era. Oloron warrants a visit of its old neighbourhoods and bridges on the Gave d'Aspe, the Sainte-Marie cathedral with its portal and its sculpture friezes showing the elders of the apocalypse playing the vielle.

CHOOSING THE RIGHT HIKE FOR YOU

The **elevation** indicated on the sheets represents the total distance climbed. Stops are not included in hiking times.

Hikes are classified by difficulty and distinguished by colours on each route's practical sheet. We adhere to the recommendations of the French Federation of Hiking.

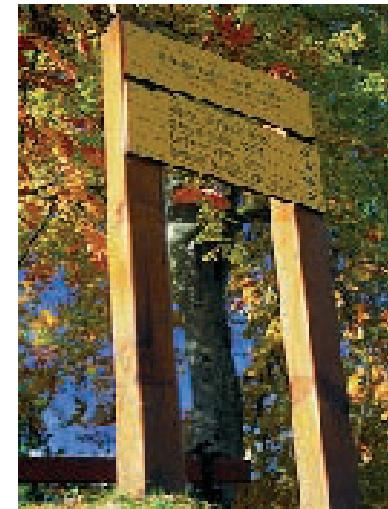
Very easy: less than 2 hours of walking. Ideal for families, on well marked-off paths.

Easy: less than 3 hours of walking. Suitable for families. On paths, occasionally with more.

Medium: less than 4 hours of walking. For hikers who are used to walking. With occasional challenging sections or slopes.

Difficult: more than 4 hours of walking. For experienced and athletic hikers. The itinerary is long and/or difficult (slopes, difficult sections).

Duration of the hike: The duration of each route is indicated for information only. It is calculated based on the length of the hike, slopes and possible difficulties.
