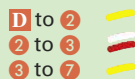

The Utziat donats

Compostela pilgrims travelling from Ostabat en Cize (canton of St Jean Pied de Port) through Larceveau during the Middle Ages were provided with accommodation by the donats of the Utziat chapel hospital. In 1343 the hamlet numbered 23 inhabitants including seven nuns and three donats' wives. The chapter used to elect three donat brothers and shared food for the year between the community, the servants and the poor. The kingpin of charitable institutions, the donats were laymen who «gave» themselves to Christ through a vow of poverty, obedience and chastity but only if widowed.

The Oztibarre valley

This walk offers the rambler the opportunity of discovering the entire Oztibarre valley at a glance. It takes you up to the top of Gazteluzahar which is an ancient protohistoric enclosure, a complex series of ramparts and earth fortifications. Once upon a time, it was the place where local populations took refuge and organized their defence.

D Take care when crossing the D933: 1h50 5 30T-652976-4789059 Go out and back on the road on the left and then follow the road opposite up to the top of Gazteluzahar (antennae).

1 30T-654589-4788532 Go back to the roundabout on the D933. Go past the roundabout to the road opposite.

0h10 2 30T-654596-4788592 Take the GR65 on the left. It is signposted in red and white. Follow it leaving the first road on the right on the corner of the wood.

0h30 3 30T-654074-4788215 At the next crossroads, leave the GR65 and turn right. Just before you reach the farm, go through the gate that is set back on the right and close it behind you. Follow the track along the floor of the little valley for 1.350 km.

1h30 4 30T-652315-4788857 When you reach the plateau, take the right hand track.

3h10 6 30T-652976-4789059 Follow the road down to the crossroads with the GR65.

3h30 7 30T-654243-4788539 Turn left, and then take the next two turnings on the right, bringing you back to the roundabout starting point. Cross the D933 and return to the car park via the D918.

CHOOSE YOUR WALK WISELY

Levels

The **change in altitude** indicated in each guide represents the total increase. Times are calculated without stops.

Walking routes are classified by difficulty and are differentiated by colours in each route's practical guide. These classifications have been made following recommendations from FF Randonnée.

Very easy under 2 hours of walking
Ideal for families, using clearly marked paths.

Easy under 3 hours of walking
Can be done as a family. Follows footpaths,

with some more difficult parts.

Average under 4 hours of walking
For those with some walking experience. Contains some fairly challenging aspects or changes in altitude.

Difficult more than 4 hours of walking
For experienced walkers. Routes are long and/or challenging (steep ascents, difficult parts).

Walk times: The time taken to complete each route is given as a guide only, taking account of the length of the route, the change in altitude and any difficult aspects.

When you ramble through the routes of Basse Navarre, we would ask you to show respect for the environment and for the men and women who bring this region to life. It is important that you follow certain rules.

Preserve the natural environment
Always carry a bag for collecting your waste and disposing of it responsibly. Respect the fauna and flora. Keep to the signposted paths.

Look after yourselves
Never start out on a walk without taking the right equipment. Try not to go it alone. Do not drink water from the streams.

Respecting local activities and inhabitants

- Make sure you close gates
- **Avoid walking with a dog. If you do have a dog with you, ensure it is kept on a lead at all times.**
- Starting fires is strictly forbidden
- Ensure you respect private property located near footpaths

Attention!

During the woodpigeon shooting season (October to November) and during the burn-beating period (December to March), some itineraries must be avoided. Please check with the tourist office.

PR® routes:

A number of hiking trails are designated as PR® routes by the FF Randonnée in accordance with quality criteria. They are selected using environmental, tourist, technical and attractiveness criteria.
