BRUGES-CAPBIS-MIFAGET

This pleasant hike in the village of Bruges-Capbis-Mifaget lets you discover the charm of the Pyrenean piedmont and a section of the Piedmont Way. This starts in Narbonne, passes by Carcassonne, then south of Toulouse by Pamiers. The pathway covers three stages featuring famous abbeys: Saint-Lizier, Saint-Bertrand-de-Comminges and Escaladieu. The way then leads to Lourdes, Bruges, Mifaget, Sainte Colome, Oloron-Sainte-Marie, L'Hôpital Saint-Blaise and Mauléon. The Piedmont Way joins up with the Puy, Way, Vézelay Way and the pathway from Tours to Ostabat near Saint-Jean-Pied-de-Port. This hike will take you into the heart of beautiful countryside, with rolling hills that shelter farms and villages at the foot of the Pyrenees.

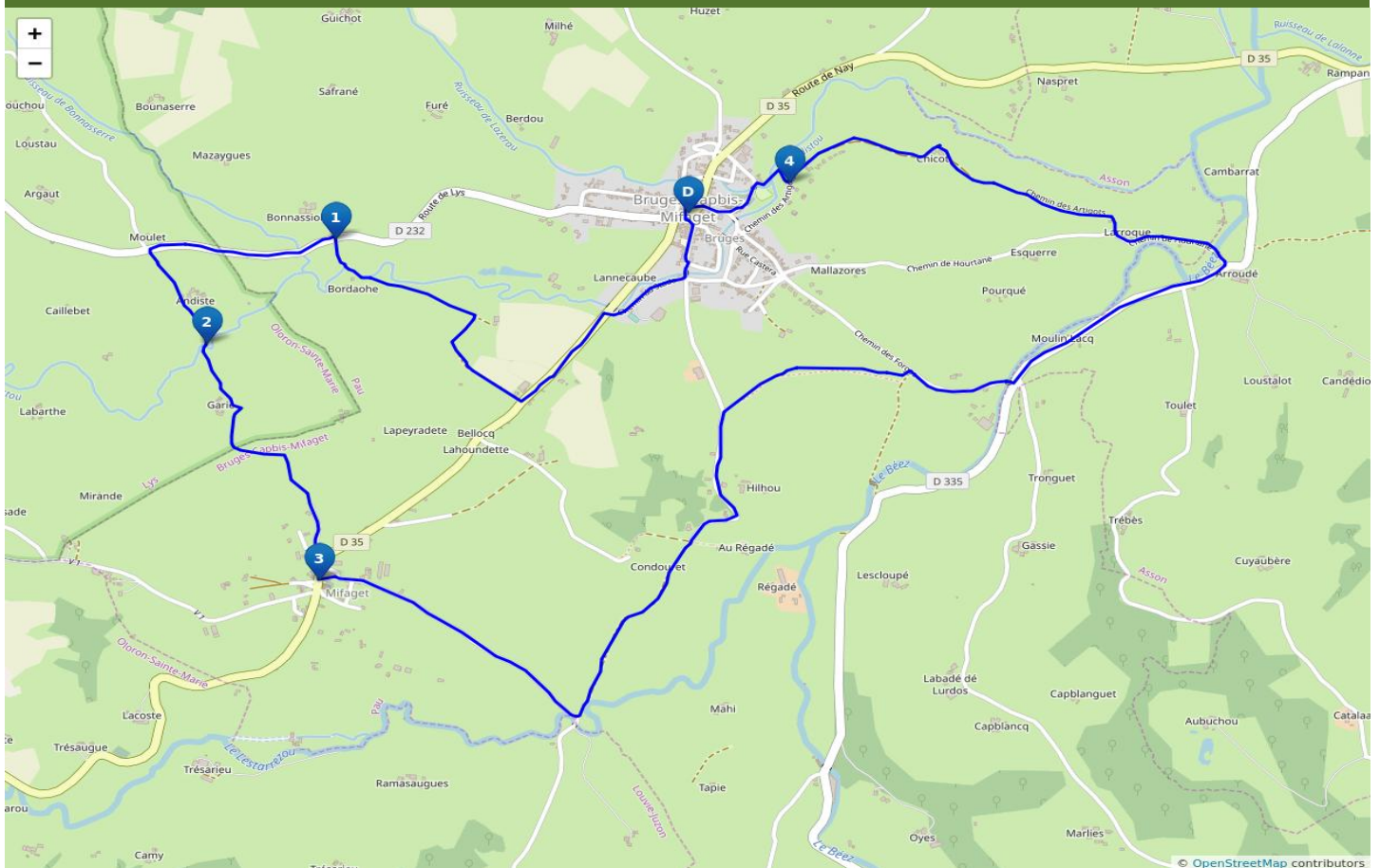
À ne pas manquer

- **Mifaget church.** Built in 1114 by Gaston IV Le Croisé (“the Crusader”), viscount of Bearn, the church is dedicated to Saint Michael. The church was modified with an extension in the 19th century, but still has many interesting elements of Romanesque art.
- **The hilly landscape.**

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Étapes

Step 1. Landiste farm. From the square Place Gaston Phébus in Bruges, with your back to the town hall, cross the square and at the end turn right on the road Rue des Ecoles. Cross the bridge over the Landistou and turn right. Then turn left on the road D35, the Route de Bruges. Walk for about 400m (?1312.34ft.) and turn right on the path Chemin de Lagoune. At the end turn right, cross the ford and go up. Turn left on the road. After 600m (1968.5ft.), at the top of the hill, go down to the left by a small sunken path that goes alongside a field. Pass by the Landiste farm and continue on the path.

Step 2. Towards Mifaget. Down from the Landiste farm, cross a footbridge and go up along a field towards the Gacié farm. Pass to the left of it and continue on a stony track. Go down towards Mifaget. At the stop sign, turn right then left on a small square with plane trees, then cross the road D35.

Step 3. Towards the fronton and the small castle.. From Mifaget, go to the left of the church and go down for about 1km (? 0.62mi.). In a bend to the right, turn left on a path lined with trees. Back on the road, turn left, go up then pass by a small castle with a fronton.

Step 4. Towards Bruges church. At the fronton, turn right by a sunken path. Back on the road turn once again to the right. At the stop sign, turn left. After 800m (? 2624.67ft) turn left, cross a pretty bridge made of stones over the Beez, then go up on the path Chemin de Hourtane. After 400m (? 1312.34ft.) turn right on a path. Back on the asphalt where there are houses, go down to the right on a path that leads to the Landistou. Cross a footbridge, pass by the washhouse and turn left. At the church turn right to go back to the start.



Attention

- Stay safe ! Large Pyrenees sheepdogs (Patous) at the Gacié farm
- Fences of the Landiste farm – but feel free to pass through them
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- Sections of road
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- Be careful when crossing the ford, slippery stones during wet weather
