

## Parcours

- 1 Leave the church of Sainte-Terre taking road D123 on your left (towards Château Gueyrosse, EHPAD, camping).
- 2 At the next crossroads, take slightly on your right the street «rue du Parlement» ( sign « circuit des condamines»).
- 3 Ride along the river and cross the hamlet. The road takes a left turn, continue on this road.
- 4 Turn on your left at the junction and continue on this road.
- 5 At the crossroads, cross road D123 and continue straight on.
- 6 Watch out for the traffic, cross road D938 and continue straight on.
- 7 At the hamlet Gros, turn right at the stop and follow the sign Saint-Hippolyte.
- 8 You can see on your right the wine cellar of Château Gaillard. Continue straight on.
- 9 At the crossroads of Saint-Hippolyte, in front of the cross, turn left towards St Laurent-des-Combes.
- 10 You arrive in St-Laurent-des-Combes. At the stop, cross road D243. Take the road in front of you towards Château Pipeau.
- 11 At the «give way» sign, in front the car park, take on your left and ride along the railway (cross the railway station on your right).
- 12 At the stop, let the railway on your right and turn left. Continue straight on up to road D 670.
- 13 Beware of the traffic. Cross road D670 and continue towards Châteaux Beurang and Clos des Prince.
- 14 Pass in front of Château Beurang, then continue straight on.
- 15 At the crossroads, turn left (2nd road on your left after Château Beurang).
- 16 Let the road on your left and on your right and continue straight on.
- 17 At the crossroads with road D243, turn left.
- 18 At the next junction, turn right (sign 3,5 T). Continue straight on up to the next main road.
- 19 Watch out for the traffic, you cross D 936. At the stop, take the road in front of you towards Château Sicard and continue straight on during 2 km.
- 20 At the stop, turn right to reach the village and the church of Ste Terre.

### Description

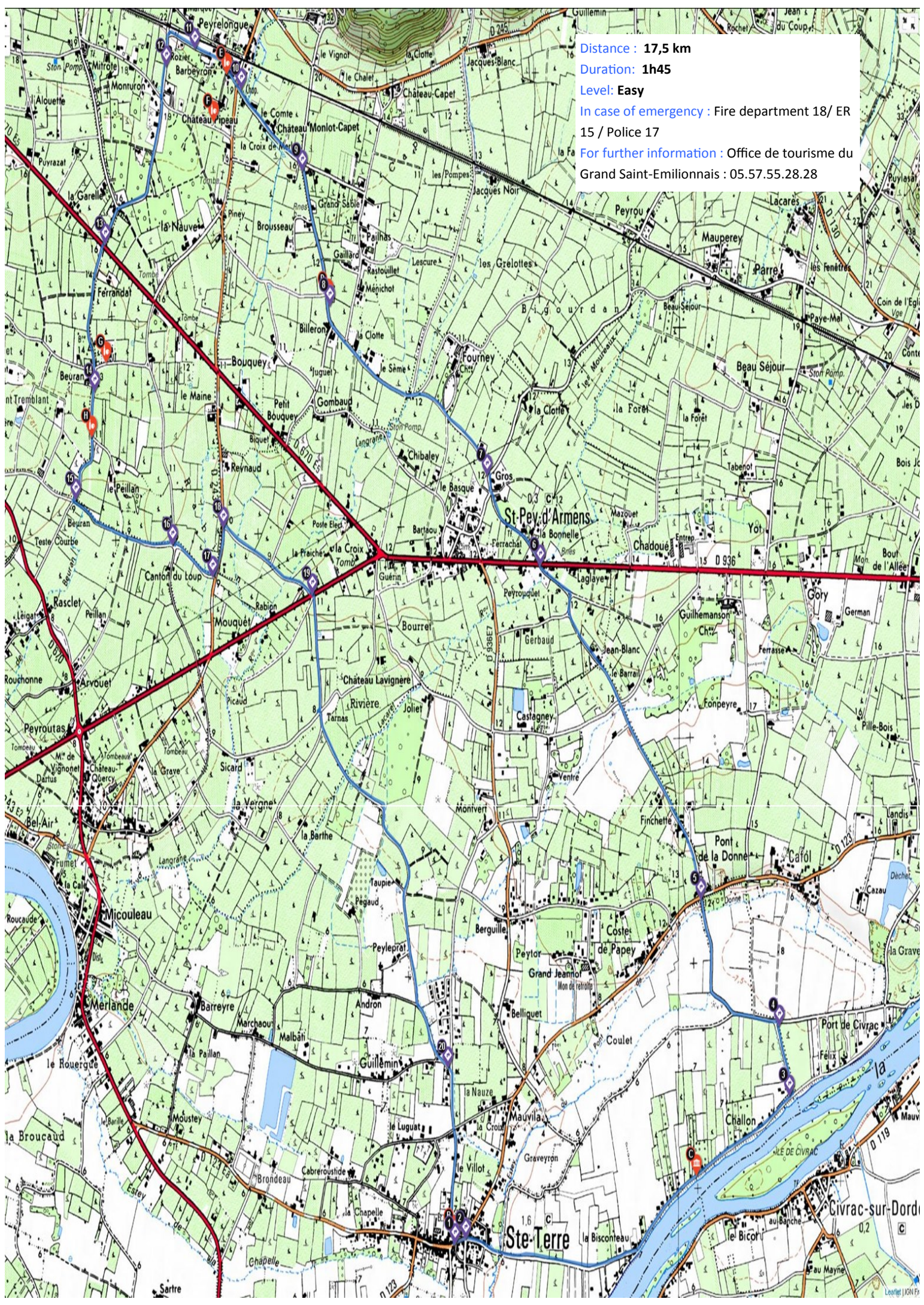

- F Château Haute-Nauve** : Saint-Emilion Grand Cru ; Mrs Reynier & Mr Mallet. Open to public from Monday to Friday, with appointment on Saturday and Sunday; 3€. Tel : 05 57 24 73 21
- G Château Clos des Prince** : Saint-Emilion Grand Cru ; Nicolas Prince . Tel : 06 37 55 39 85. Open by appointment from Monday to Saturday. Fee : 6€.
- H Château Beurang** : Saint-Emilion AOC ; Delphine Puyol-Milcent & Claude Puyol. Tel : 05 57 24 73 31. Open to public all days. No charge.
