


N° 48 Cabane de Boué V LESCUN WALKING



The Cabane de Boué stands on a floral plateau at the foot of the Mail d'Eygarry. It's easy to reach making it perfect for all the family! It starts off in the shade of tall beech and fir trees and it's magical when you reach the plateau. The views here are incredible and the atmosphere is peaceful.


À ne pas manquer

• Lily. As you enter the woods, there are a few Martagon lilies on the left that you can see in summer.

• Cross trunks. Due to its weight, snow slides slowly (reptation) all winter and takes trees with it. The result is this cross shape at the foot of the trunk.

• The Billare. The Billare (2312m) jumps out at you on the way back out of the woods!

• Cabane de Boué. Shepherds used to live here and it is now a welcoming spot for hikers. It has space for 4 at an altitude of 1452m.



🖸 Étapes

Step 1. Path in the beech forest. You can park at the top of a very steep ramp in front of the big Labérouat car park. Go a few metres down the road and take the left-hand path. It starts out rocky then goes into the woods and round the hillside with a few bumps. Exit the woods and go through the clearing on a sunken path. As you approach the ridge, take a quick look back to see the majestic Billare mountain.

Step 2. Anitch Woods. Carry on along the wide hillside track. The beech forest feels refreshing and pleasant. Cross the stream (Le Haut d'Anitch post) and ignore the path on the right. Walk a few metres and fork left on the path. Higher up the beech trees make way for fir trees. Ride over the Copen mountain stream and come out in a clearing that you then cross.

Step 3. Cabin. Go past the stream and carry on along a lovely path. The view opens out before turning onto the North East side. Go past this shaded area and the stream. The path goes up slightly towards the plateau. After a grassy and sometimes damp area, the path forks left and gets lost in the bilberries and junipers. Head right at a shelter and go up to a horizontal track. Follow it on the right until you reach the Cabane de Boué. Step 4. Return. The way back is the same as the way up.

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
