The big Sainte-Foy-la-Grande Bastide game



It's strategic position near Perigord made it very desirable fortified town. It was an English bastide conquered in the XVth century then became a protestant shelter in the XVIth century.




The church built at the creation of the bastide by the Templars, then destroyed in 1561 during the religious wars, was reconstructed under Louis XIII.
