



Take the Docteur Jacques Noel Road to your right. Stop when the number 23 is reached.


This building was once used by a ferrant marshal. What animals head can be found on the facade?

Continue down the road and stop at the deadlock Gauvin. The building you can see here is called « La Salle Des Fetes De la Commune », where many events are planned.

Continue until you reach 25 Cours Pierre Lassalle. The building in front of you had, at once, a particulare purpose.

In this, rather abstract, blazon we can find references to the beach, to pine trees and to the estuary. The Red Losange indicated the location of the commune in the Médoc.
